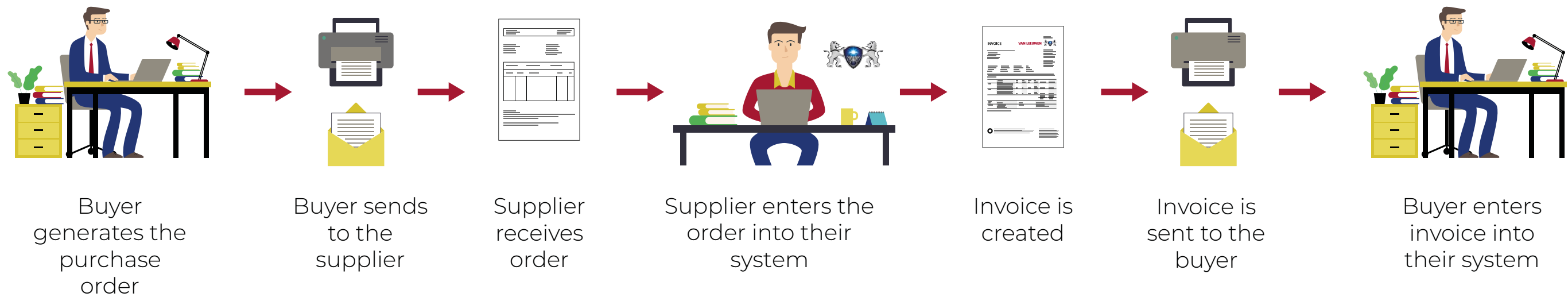

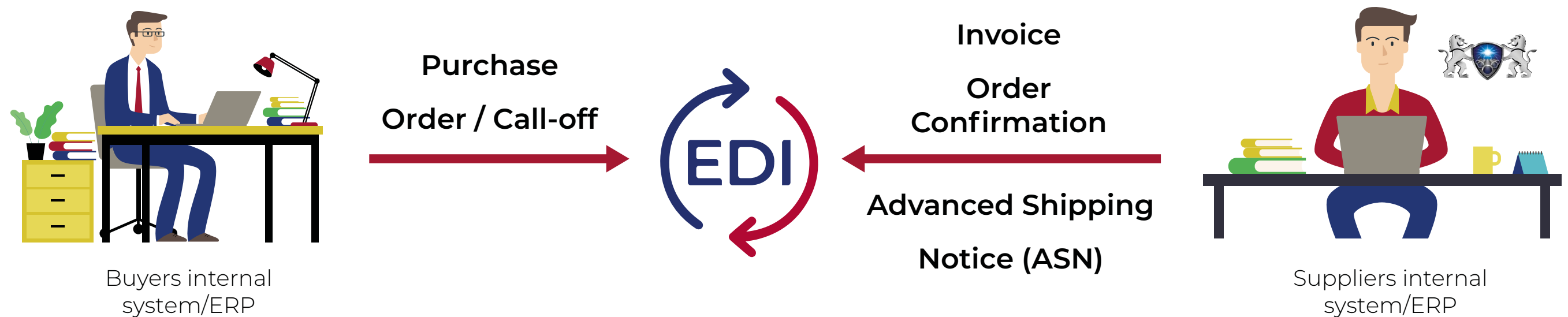


→ What is EDI (Electronic Data Interchange)?

→ What's in it for your organization?

Strong **BENEFITS** that make EDI a quick win for your business and our partnership

Process cost reduction

- Eliminate RFQ process (for agreed products)
- Reduce repeated entries
- Reduce the paper-bound and email document flow
- Easy goods receipt posting (ASN)
- Automated posting of the supplier invoice

Transparency in the value chain

- Know more through statistics
- Fast, safe and regular information exchange
- Early availability of information leading to high planning reliability

Reliable supply

- Reduce misunderstandings and manual errors through direct exchange of data from ERP to ERP system
- Early involvement of suppliers in the planning and approval process
- Optimized goods intake and planning processes as a base for working capital improvements (e.g. JIT)





→ How to implement EDI?

Standardized process for an
EASY and FAST implementation

1. Commercial To Do's

- Agree a letter of intent
- Define the scope of products (materials, price agreements, etc.)
- Agree on the rules (quantity, frequency, frozen zone, etc.)
- Define the scope of data exchange (message types)

 4–6 weeks

2. Technical To Do's

- Exchange technical connection information
- Technical setup and implementation of agreed message types
- Tests and release

 3–4 weeks
